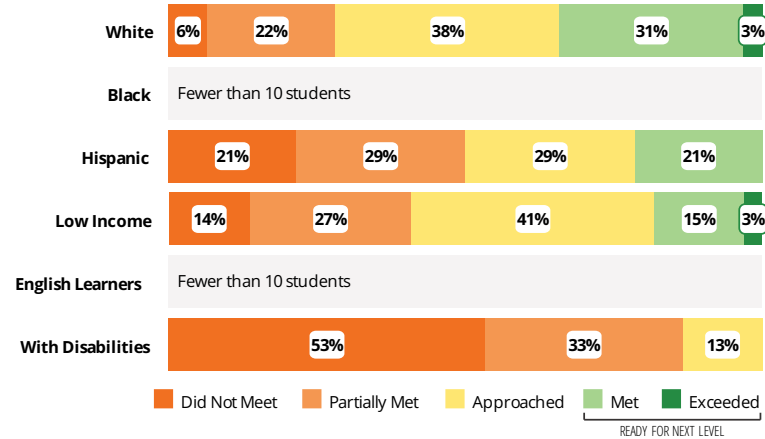
## Academic Success

## Success by Student Group

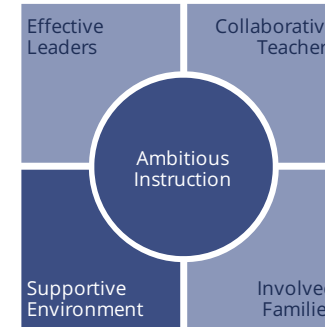

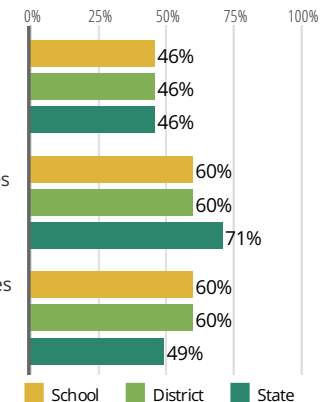

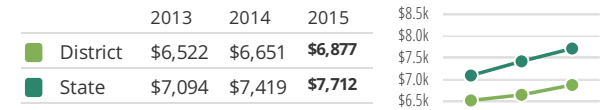

### Facilities

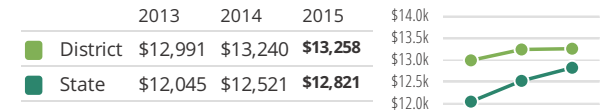

### Attendance Rate

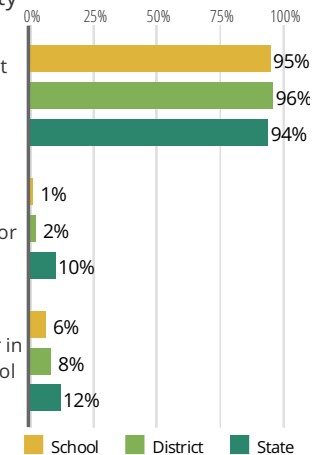
Rate at which students are present at school, not including excused or unexcused absences
